Digest the story:

1. Describe the “Outcome-based” debate format that we see in Chapter 16. How did it help the candidates to discuss solutions to the National Debt?
2. Why does the nation turn against the candidates after the above debate?
3. What was Franklin inspired to plan during his intense confrontation with Will Coleman?
4. Describe the tone of the final debate in Philadelphia, along with the relationship that had evolved between the two campaigns.

Consider current Events:

1. Compare and contrast *Running Mate’s* Outcome-based debate format with our current practice.
2. How does our nation receive non-traditional candidates who reject the established status quo? Describe the mixed reactions they can expect and give examples if you can.
3. Do you believe that our current system of government can be reformed and made more effective, or is this the best it can be in such a divided society?

Think about leadership:

1. While effective leadership requires good communication skills, many citizens limit their communication to texting and social media. How does this hinder leadership development and what is the best way for young people to develop the critical interpersonal skills they’ll need for leadership?
2. None of us will ever have absolute power, which means that leaders must learn how to influence people and systems without controlling them. Name someone who does this extremely well, and rate yourself in this area.
